

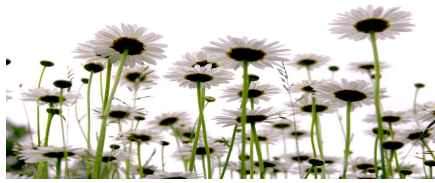
HEALTHY FAMILIES
