#### LAYING DOWN THE LAW

Many people think the Bible is just a bunch of rules and lessons to learn to help you live better and please God. We've talked about why this isn't a useful view of Scripture, but what do we do with the laws and teachings?

**Exodus 20:2** - The laws of the Bible are not the **requirement** for salvation. They are the **response** to salvation.

When Jesus arrives, He doesn't **lower** the standard for righteousness. He actually **raises** it! (Matthew 5:21-22, 27-28)

If the Law is a standard, we can't meet it. There's a problem in our hearts.

The Law can **describe** the good life, but it cannot **produce** it.

**Romans 8:3-4** - Jesus fulfills the requirements of the Law <u>for</u> us; His Spirit generates the righteousness of the Law <u>in</u> us.

God's laws aren't changing, but that old way of measuring up is gone.

We move from **performance** to **transformation**.

## FREE FOR ALL

We live with Elsa's contemporary philosophy of freedom: "No right, no wrong, no rules for me. I'm free!" ("Let it Go," *Frozen*)

According to the Bible, the elimination of boundaries—the ability to do whatever we want—is not freedom. That's **slavery**! (John 8:34)

True freedom is the ability to do whatever you should, to not be chained to the whims of our disordered wants.

**John 8:31-32** - Jesus says that freedom lies in the **truth** of God's word. However, truth without grace is **mean**. Grace without truth is **meaningless**.

John 1:14 - Jesus came 100% full of truth, and 100% full of grace.
